The Winnebago County Sheriffs Department and Neenah Police Department will display their armored SWAT vehicles throughout the event. **NEW THIS YEAR!!!** More fun for the kids!!! FunPros will provide an inflatable bounce house for kids 12 and under. Kids are welcome to stop at the "goodie" table to pick up free ideas such as McGruff coloring books, badge stickers, pencils, stuffed animals, activity books, etc. Participating departments will also be hosting a variety of safety awareness activities for kids and families such as car seat checks, DNA Kits, fire safety, G.R.E.A.T. programming, etc.

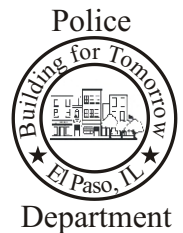
